

- 1 Right of RAM: black 5-pin "PPD" connector for elusive internal UPS called "Power Protection Device", which fits in an optical drive slot and has another 3-pin cable direct to the PSU for input/output of rectified mains voltage

- 3 Right of ATX: 3-pin fan connector which is input only (the PSU fan - which on the desktop model doubles as CPU fan - is internally powered, fixed speed, and without feedback), short pins 1 and 3 to use a 3rd party power brick
- 4
- 5 4-pins connector down from CPU: intrusion switch, CD audio (should be Soundblaster type), internal amplified speaker and its power

- 7 The large connectors on the edge are data (PCI?) and power for the optional 2x ISA adapter ☹

- 9 Original CPU: Pentium 3 800EB/133/256k, BIOS has a detailed list according to microcode ID
